

Federal-Provincial Infrastructure Funding Agreement Contribution Breakdown

Canada-Alberta Bilateral Agreement Contribution Breakdown of Approved Projects

The Government of Canada is providing **more than \$543.9 million**, with additional funds coming from Alberta Transportation and local municipalities, for public transit and water and wastewater projects across Alberta following the signing of the Canada-Alberta bilateral agreement. The charts below represent the amount of funding for eligible costs for approved projects announced on September 1, 2016.

Water and Wastewater Projects

The Government of Canada is providing **more than \$196.7 million for water and wastewater projects** throughout Alberta, through the Clean Water and Wastewater Fund (CWWF). The federal funding for approved water and wastewater projects announced today is **more than \$132.2 million, leaving more than \$64.4 million** in funds available for projects to be announced in the coming weeks. Public Transits Projects

The Government of Canada is providing **more than \$347.1 million** for public transit projects in Alberta's major urban and rural communities through the Public Transit Infrastructure Fund (PTIF). The federal funding for approved public transit projects announced today is **more than \$212 million, leaving more than \$135 million** in funds available for projects to be announced in the coming weeks.
